Unauthorised Materials

Mobiles/ Smart Glasses/ Watches/ Ear pieces / Mirrors and Electronic Devices are **NOT allowed in Examination Venues**

All pockets should be empty when entering the exam venue. Carry plain water bottles in your hand. Please leave other items in your bag or your locker



Unauthorised Materials

If you are found to be in possession of any of these items, this is called malpractice and you will be reported to the Exam Board who will make all decisions on the outcome of your malpractice

Consequences

The normal outcome in these circumstances is either to disqualify:-

- Your individual paper
- The whole subject papers
- You from sitting any exams for 5 years

In certain situations more than one candidate can be affected by the outcome.

Authorised Materials

- Your exam timetable (free from graffiti)
- Black pen
- Clear, see through bottle with all labels removed, with only water in the bottle

There will always be writing equipment, calculators and tissues provided in each main exam venue

Regulations of the Exam

Once entering the Exam venue please find your seat in silence. All tables will be labelled in number order

Ensure you sit in your seat number that is shown on your timetable.

You must not talk, communicate or disturb any other candidates whilst you are in the Exam venue. This is malpractice and the Exam Board will have to be informed.

If you need assistance, put your hand up and an Invigilator will come over.

If you have any questions please contact the Exams Office well before your exam, who will support you.

Regulations of the Exam

At the start of each exam, listen to the instructions of the invigilator.

If you think you have been given the incorrect question paper put your hand up.

Fill in the details required on the front of your question paper or answer booklet. Please ensure that you write your Legal name on all exam papers.

Please remember your candidate number as you need to write this on every exam paper.

Do not write or draw anything other than the answers on your paper. Examiners will not mark any paper that has graffiti or pictures that do not relate to the question and you will be awarded zero marks.

All answers and workings out must be completed in the official answer booklets only.

Students are NOT allowed to leave the exam venue before the official finish time and only when the invigilator dismisses them.

Toilet Breaks

It is the Exam Board ruling that no candidate may leave the venue at any time unaccompanied. Centres have to abide by these rules

Centres have to inform the Exam Boards of any candidate leaving the venue for any reason, and they will be required to sign the form at the front which states the time they leave and return.

It is the Exam Board ruling that no candidates (unless they have a medical pass) can have a toilet break within the last 30 minutes of the exam finish time.

Please ensure you understand this and that you 'pop to the loo' before entering the exam venue

If you have any concerns, please come and see your Head of Year or the Exams Team well before the start of the Exam season

Things to work on from the Mocks

Some things that need to be worked on from the March Mock Exams:

- If you are permitted, via your year team, to use blue tac or a stress ball then this needs to be checked by a member of the Exams Team on entry to the exam and can only be used discreetly in your pocket, not on the desk as this distracts others
- Make sure you remove your watch and leave it in your locker/bag or at home
- Bring your own water bottle - This must be a clear bottle with all labels removed before you enter the exam and needs to be carried in your hand not your pocket
- You MUST complete all of the details on the front of your exam paper and sign it if needed. Not completing all of the details can lead to your paper not being marked
- We will provide all stationary required for your exam which you need to leave on your desk when you finish your exam
- Ensure you enter the exam hall in silence and not communicating with others. When you leave please bear in mind that other exams might still be going on near you

Malpractice Summer 2024

5,190 students in England had penalties given for malpractice up from 4,900 in 2023 (a 6% increase)

41% of the above were for mobile phone/other mobile device offences

24% For unauthorised or inappropriate materials

23% Other reasons

7% were for Disruptive behaviour

2% inappropriate writing/drawings on exam papers

3% Plagiarism

Absent from Exams

If you are ill on the day of your exam, **please telephone the College by 8.15am**

On your return, please **collect a JCQ self certification form 14** from the Head of Year or Exams Office.

This form requires completion and signing by the following people to be able for the College to apply for special consideration to the Awarding Body who will make a decision on the overall outcome for a grade.

Part A Head of Centre/Examinations Officer

Part B The Parent/Guardian or Carer

Part C The Student

Absent from Exams

Once all parts of the form have been completed, signed and returned to the Exams Office, only then can the College apply for special consideration of the missed exam paper.

This must be done within 7 days of the candidate returning to College

Without the signed form - the College cannot apply

Arriving late to an exam

The College will attempt to contact a student's home if they fail to attend an exam at the scheduled time

If a student is late for their exam, the Centre must submit a full report to the Exam Board who will make the decision on allowing the paper to be marked or not

If you do not turn up for your exam without a valid reason, you could be charged for the entry cost (between £42 - £120)

School Uniform

You will only be allowed to enter the exam venues in **full school uniform**.

Blazer, tie, school shoes, school skirt/trousers
