We wish all our students a wonderful summer and we look forward to welcoming you back in September.

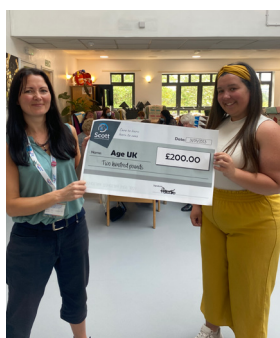

Awards Evening 2023

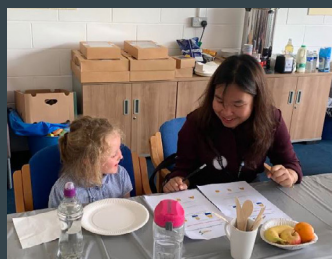
It was a night filled with pride, joy, and a celebration of accomplishments as Scott College presented its first-ever Awards Ceremony.

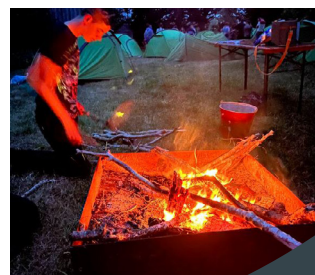


Silver DofE Qualifier Expedition

Equipped with their unwavering determination, trusty maps, and laden rucksacks, these young adventurers set out to conquer the picturesque landscapes Exmoor had to offer.

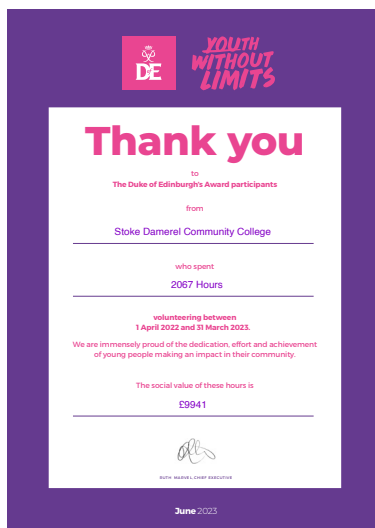

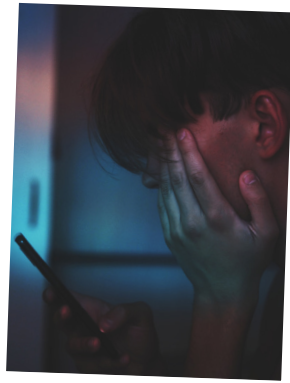
