On Thursday 3rd March, Mrs Humpherson and Mrs Mann attended Millbay Academy for a careers fair. They had a stand to promote Scott College and also an area for Mrs Mann to demonstrate CPR and how to use a defibrillator, which students really enjoyed observing. They spoke to students from different year groups and about the different options and pathways available to them after year 11.



## **Inspiration for our students**

This week, Tommy, one of our Year 13 students, shared his inspiration for studying biomedical science in the future.

Sir Alexander Fleming was born in Scotland to parents who were farmers. He attended Louden Moor School, Darvel School and Kilmarnock Academy before attending university in London. He entered St Mary's Medical School and in 1906 qualified with distinction where he began to research under Sir Almroth Wright, a pioneer in vaccine therapy. Throughout the first world war he served as a Captain in the Army Medic Corps and in 1918 returned to Scotland. Fleming had always had an interest in natural bacterial action in the blood and even continued his studies when in the military.

While working on the influenza virus, he observed that a mould had grown onto a culture plate and around it had created a circle, free from bacteria. He then made the decision to experiment further with the mould and found that it prevented staphylococcus growth even when being diluted 800 times – this substance he named penicillin. Finally, in 1943 he was elected as a Fellow of the Royal Society and then knighted in 1944. This inspired me personally to apply to Biomedical science at Plymouth University which I have recently received an offer for.
