### **Year 9 History Trip**

On the 6th December, history teacher, Mr Simpson, will be taking 34 year 9 students to Exeter Cathedral to explore medieval pilgrimage practices and look at some of the primary sources that the cathedral holds.

The trip will involve a guided tour around the Cathedral and workshops where students will be able to see a number of primary sources on medical texts, as well as sources on medieval pilgrimage and some of the oldest Anglo-Saxon sources in the country.

This is a great opportunity for students to deepen and broaden their historical understanding of various time periods and provides excellent contextual knowledge for the GCSE papers. Students will visit the tomb of Bishop Lacey which was a medieval pilgrimage locale and site of votive offerings, some of which are the only existent examples in the UK.
