The students at Scott College took part in an engaging and practical

session as they witnessed a demonstration of CPR techniques.

The initiative aimed to equip these young individuals with lifesaving skills, fostering confidence in their ability to respond effectively to cardiac emergencies.

Each student had the opportunity to practice CPR and understand the functioning of a defibrillator. This hands-on approach not only demystified the life-saving procedures but also allowed students to actively participate and build confidence in their abilities.

In addition to the practical training, each student received a leaflet containing crucial information about CPR, including the main steps and details about the location of the nearest defibrillator.

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
Mary Poppins rehearsals in full swing!
