

Dear Parent/Carers,

Year 13 last few weeks at Scott Medical and Healthcare College

We are fast approaching the start of the Level 3 Exams for 2025 and we have been preparing the students through assemblies with some important information regarding the exam season. The more familiar they can be with the routines the more they become second nature and the more they can concentrate on their subject preparation instead of worrying about procedures. Your help reinforcing this at home would be very beneficial to them.

How can you help?

1. The exam season is a stressful time for pupils, and they are likely to be feeling under pressure. You can really support your child by ensuring that they **eat properly and at regular intervals**, get some **early nights** and have a **quiet area at home to revise**.
2. You can support revision by asking questions from their revision material, providing encouragement and, if you feel able, the odd incentive to maintain motivation.
3. Ensure they have a revision schedule . They should try and keep to it, but this is not always easy - work with them to adjust it as they go, ensure it's manageable - reduce it if they are working too hard, motivate them if they are not doing enough.

Exam timetable

All students have been given an exam timetable. If they lose it, they need to ask for a replacement.

Exam warm ups

Before every exam we will have an exam warm up where we will reassure the students and go over any last minute tips or key points to help focus them so they are as best prepared for the exams as possible. This runs from **8am - 8.30am**. Students need to report to reception by 8am and they will be directed by members of staff where they need to go. There will be a **cut off at 8.05am** to minimise disruption. At 'exam warm-up' students have access to breakfast snacks and a drink (toast, bagels, hot chocolate).

ALL students will then have a final warm up and preparation checks from **8.30-8.40am**. Afternoon 'exam warm up' will take place during period 4. Students then go into early lunch on that day as exams start at 1.30pm. Students will be given information where they need to go on a daily basis by their tutors for these warm ups.

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Exam expectations

Students will be provided with all the equipment they need in the exam hall, although it is helpful to have a black pen for example. Nothing can be taken into the exam hall, which includes water bottles with labels, no mobile phones or smart watches. Students are expected to adhere to the [full dress code policy](#) for all examinations - this includes lanyards and footwear. **We will turn away any student that does not follow these expectations, or they may be sent home to change, making them late or miss the exam.**

Students do not need to follow the Sixth Form dress code but they must attend these sessions with the correct attitude and 100% focus. Pupils will officially leave school on the day they complete their final exam, and they must remain available up until and including this day.

Year 13 Results Day – Thursday 14th August 2024

A-Level / BTEC results can be collected from the school sports hall on [Thursday 14th August 2024](#) [between 10.00am and 11.30am](#). There will be staff present on the day to direct pupils to their collection point.

Pupils must collect their results in person. However, if they would like us to give their results to a parent or other family member, the pupil must give them a signed letter giving their permission. The collecting adult will also need to present some form of identification such as a driving license or passport which matches the name on the letter.

Next Steps Guidance

The Sixth Form team will be available to assist with anything that arises on results day, be it a UCAS offer or what to do next, we will be there to help. We will also be available on Friday 15th August between 10 and 12 for anyone who wishes to come in and discuss their future. Please do not hesitate to ask.
